Bharatanatyam is the oldest Indian classical dance form, originally performed in temples to showcase mythological stories. My fascination with the mythology of Indian gods and goddesses drove my interest in this ancient art form, which I saw as a medium for narrating tales through graceful movements.

In September 2023, I had performed my solo dance repertoire in Hong Kong, comprising of 9 Bharatanatyam dance pieces performed in 2 hours duration.

Another major highlight of my dancing journey is participation at Hong Kong's national parade during Chinese New Year in Feb, 2024; along with live coverage in national TV channels.
